In addition: good propagation, low noise, and parallel contests to visit and capture QSO's. I used a newly acquired Yaesu FTdx10 (GREAT rig!), 135 ft non-resonant doublet inverted V at 28 ft; 20m 1/4 vertical w/ 4 elevated radials, 100w solar panel with 135 amp-hour of SLAB capacity. My unfamiliarity with the radio cost me 4 hours "Off the Air" I must have changed some setting, as the output power went down to ZERO! I had to set aside my Yaesu and deployed the backup rig: FT-817nd. I started watching training videos on JS8Call (blah), and instead made some PSK31 contacts. After four hours a text conversation with K6WSC prompted me to reset the FTdx10 firmware to the factory settings -- thankfully that restored the Yaesu's power! It's an amazing radio; the user just needs more training. I operated from BLM land about 3 miles SE of the Cibola National Wildlife Refuge.
